Probate granted at Oxford on 3 May 1718 in the presence of Joseph Woodward doctor of law and official of the Archdeacon of Berkshire to Elizabeth Strainge, widow and relict the said deceased [Richard Strainge] and nominated executrix in the said will, who was Richard Straing of Long wittenham being weak in Body butt of good and perfect Memory blessed bee the Lord for itt doe mak and Constitutt this \to bee/ my Last will & testament Imprimes I Comitt my Soule & body into the hands / of god my saviour & my body to bee decently buried by my Executrix// Item I give & bequeath unto my daughter Ann [Straing] \Latherum/ the summ of tenn pounds to be p[ai]d her within one yeare after/ my decease: and to my sonn John straing five pounds / and to my daughter Elizabeth winter five pounds: / And to my sonn Robertt straing tenn pounds: and to / my daughter Martha Straing tenn pounds and to my / sonn William Straing one shilling: and to my sonn / Adam Straing one shilling and all thes Legacies to / bee p[ai]d within one whole yeare After the death of my / Executrix and All the Restt of my goods & Chattels After / my LDebts & funerall Charges paid I give and bequeath / unto my beloved wiff Elizabeth whom I mak and / Constitutt to bee my Soule & whole Executrix of / this my Lastt will and Testement which I declare itt / to bee and hereunto I have sett my hand and seale the / 25th day of November 1715// Sealled and Subscribed in the presenc of us The mark of William Leaver [signed] Richard I Straing Samuell Field [signed] and my will is th[a]t Adam shall have the barn / for his Mesuag to his half yard land [?] & my sonn W[illia]m / to have all the Residue of the homstall for his Cottag.
